

by greetings go to all Rotarians of the Rotary Club of Kuching Central on this special occasion of the club's annual Installation ceremony and greetings as well to your many guests. I am honoured to take part in the function this year.

Sarawak is lucky to have a thriving Rotary community which can be proud of the positive examples it has provided to the wider community in many different areas.

Lunderstand that in the past few years, the Rotary Club of Kuching Central has organised several projects which have involved collecting and distributing items that some people no longer wanted but to others can make all the difference. Projects have included the collection and distribution of 32,000 items of used clothing to victims of fire and the needy. They also collected and distributed 1,000 reference books to rural schools. Together with their sister club of Taiwan, they demonded RM30,000 to the construction of a school and in a joint effort with Microsoft, they demonded legal and original desktop and multimedia software to the value of RM1.5 million to school computer clubs throughout the state. In another campaign, 3,000 new and used toys were collected and distributed to underprivileged children. For the elderly, 500 pairs of reading spectacles were distributed in conjunction with a state wide literacy programme.

For the year ahead the club will endeavor to sponsor a Rotaract Club in Kuching for young adults -30 years old. They arranged and will sponsor a volunteer from England to teach English a school in Kuching. In addition the club are keen to promote environmental awareness and support tree planting and cleanliness campaign.

The immediate priority must be to quote the Rotary Theme for the coming year 1998/99 "Follow your Rotary dreams".




