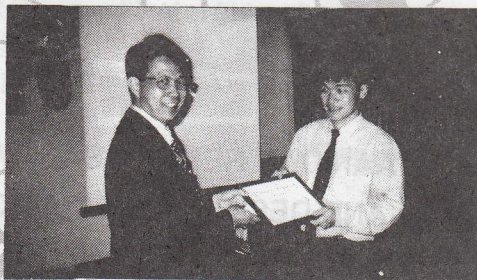
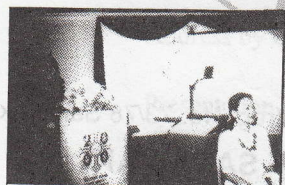



- Recognise the club member who sponsors the most new members this year.
- Highlight your club's service to the community by conducting regular outreach to local media. Place a supplement or a news release in a local newspaper, regarding a specific project, event, or outstanding Rotarian.
- Retain members in Rotary by helping those who relocate join a club in their new community.
- Hold a club program dedicated to Rotary Recreational and Vocational Fellowships.
- Recognise an outstanding club member with the Four Avenues of Service Citation for Individual Rotarians.
- Have each member give a copy of the Rotary Magazine to a professional colleague who is not currently a member of a Rotary club.
- Dedicate a meeting to educate members on available resources from RI, such as publications, the RI Web site, and task forces. Contact and use one of these resources to receive help in some way.
- Encourage diversity of membership in your club. Induct at least one new member from a demographic group not previously represented in your club.
- Support a special emphasis promoted by your district.

- Sponsor or cooperate with another organization in an eye care project in your community.
- Find employment for people in your community with disabilities.
- Sponsor a micro-lending project in your community to help reduce poverty.
- Sponsor or participate in a project to feed the hungry.

- Organize an Interact club, Rotaract club or Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) event.
 - Sponsor a project focused on crime reduction and violence prevention.
 - Sponsor or participate in a local program of AIDS awareness.

 - Undertake a project that teaches parents the importance of parental responsibility.
 - Sponsor or participate in a project to help a disadvantaged group in your community.
 - Support a special emphasis promoted by your district.

- Participate in a Group Study Exchange or a Rotary Friendship Exchange program to experience the internationality of Rotary.

District Goals For The Year 2000 / 2001

Our District Goals for Rotary Year 2000-01 will be in line with President Frank J Devlyn's theme "Create Awareness and Take Action".

1. PRESIDENTIAL CITATION

Every club in our District should view the goals set by our RI President and carry out the programs and projects with the view to earning the Presidential Citation. Clubs are required to meet these goals between 1st July 2000 and 1st April 2001. The form in duplicate signed by the President and Secretary must reach me by 15th March 2001 to be in time for signing by RI President by 15th April 2001.

2. MEMBERSHIP GROWTH

Membership growth is essential to sustain our programs and projects. All clubs with less than 25 members are strongly encouraged to exceed this number. Those with more than 25 members should aim for a net increase of 5% growth.

Let us recognise Rotarians who bring in new members like we recognise Paul Harris Fellows. Let us make Rotary Clubs more accessible to people of different backgrounds as we take pride on our diversity in Rotary. Let us aim for quality membership, and consolidate rather than chartering new clubs, unless there are exceptional reasons.

3. PUBLIC RELATIONS AND MEDIA AWARENESS

Rotary Clubs are encouraged to ride on rapid information technology to create public and media awareness to promote Rotary image. In the new Millemmum, we have to live with the power of public relations; so why not take advantage of these opportunities.

4. ROTARY FOUNDATION

I encourage every Rotary Club to continue supporting the Rotary Foundation and to participate in its humanitarian and educational programs. Whilst we continue to support restricted donations, I would urge all Rotarians to positively consider unrestricted donations so that our District will benefit from a more generous SHARE system allocation of funds in the Foundation programs.

5. INTERNATIONAL SERVICE

The District will continue to be actively involved in most programs such as GSE, WCS, Youth Exchange, Rotary Friendship, Rotary Village/Community Corp and other activities that give Rotary this unique international flavour. For the first time, our District is looking at having a second GSE team to a neighbouring country.

6. SERVICE TO NEW GENERATIONS

The District will, and urge all clubs to, continue to invest and provide seed funds for training our youth, our major assets, to meet the challenges of a global and knowledge based economy.

7. ROTARY IN THE NEW MILLENNIUM

Whilst we continue with the usual community service projects within or outside our respective communities, we have to be mindful that Rotary is going into a new Millennium which in some respects call for new thoughts and focus. All clubs and Rotarians are encouraged to participate in e-mail communication and the benefits of instant information. RI has established task forces at World Headquarters and regionally to support and provide instant information guidance and support to Rotarians worldwide in their programs and projects. We have to look at future directions for Rotary in our District to be proactive and effective. A strategic planning committee has been set up towards this direction.

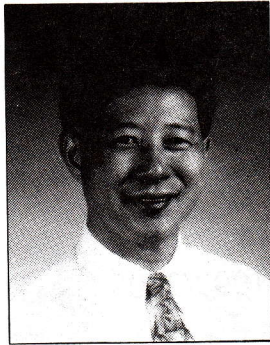

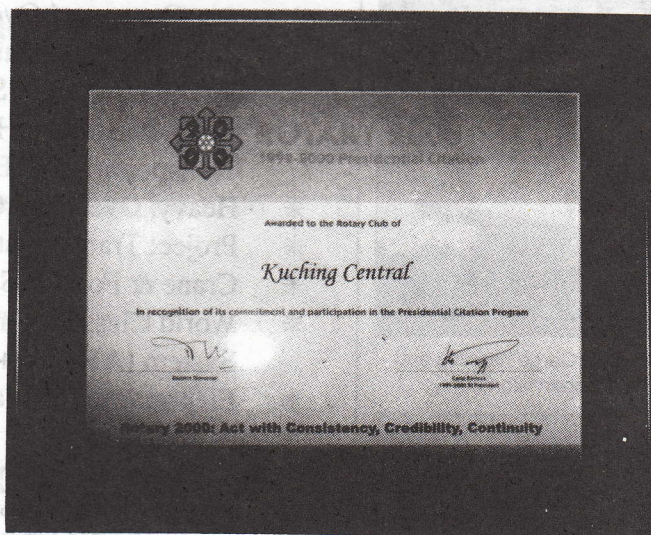

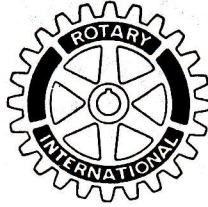

Meeting agreed that this task be undertaken by PP Lt Col Devan Pilai and PP Dr. Ong Shak Foo.

FORMATION

- APR 25,86 - 1st Interest Meeting for the formation of a "New" Rotary Club in Kuching held on Friday 5:30 PM at the Mulu Room, Holiday Inn Kuching organised by President John Chin (85/86), PP Lt Col Devan Pilai and Secretary Joseph Lim and attended by upcoming citizens from various walks of life in the State Capital.
- MAY 02,86 - 2nd Interest Meeting also at the Holiday Inn Kuching elected the PRO-TEM COMMITTEE of the PROVISIONAL CLUB.
- MAY 09,86 - 3rd Interest Meeting elected Mr. Chua Teck Kheng, Senior Agriculture Economist attached to the Agriculture Dept Sarawak - President of the new Club.
- Members voted for the weekly fellowship to be held on every Thursday 5:30 PM
 - The proposed name chosen was the "Rotary Club of Bandar Kuching"

THE PROVISIONAL CLUB

- MAY 12,86 - 1st Board of Directors' Meeting of the new club was held at the Army Officers' Mess at Reservoir Road, Kuching attended by Club Advisors: IPP John Chin (85.86) PP Lt Col Devan Pilai and PP Dr. Ong Shak Foo.
- Meeting was informed that the Sponsoring Club - "Rotary Club of Kuching" was generally not in favour of the proposed name as it may lead to membership confusion and it was agreed that the choice of a new name be left to the members' during the next weekly Meeting.
- MAY 15,86 - 1st Weekly Meeting to be held on Thursday 5:30 PM
- 1st Overseas Visitors: RTN Reg Stokes and Ann from the "Rotary Club of Bairnsdale" Victoria Australia who also presented their club Banner to the Club.

- After many a speech in support of this or that name, the majority voted in favour of the "ROTARY CLUB OF KUCHING CENTRAL", (PROVISIONAL) as proposed by Rtn. Wong Kho Ching.

JUN 05,86 - Sergeant-at-Arms, RTN Ang Khim Hwa was the 1st member to introduce himself and spoke on this classification - Mathematics Education.

JUN 19,86 - Club Banner Design incorporating the historic Borneo High Court House in Kuching by virtue of its "Central" location and symbolising the first 2 tenets of the FOURWAY TEST of ROTARY : the Pursuit of TRUTH and FAIRNESS to be undertaken by RTN Odita Ibrahim.

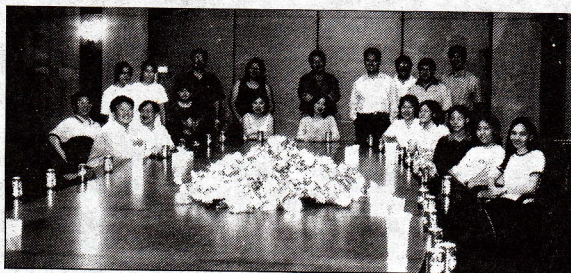
