



ROTARY HISTORY

A Brief History

The world's first service club, the Rotary Club of Chicago, Illinois, USA, was formed on 23 February 1905 by Paul P. Harris, an attorney who wished to recapture in a professional club the same friendly spirit he had felt in the small towns of his youth. The name "Rotary" derived from the early practice of rotating meetings among members' offices.

Rotary's popularity spread throughout the United States in the decade that followed; clubs were chartered from San Francisco to New York. By 1921, Rotary clubs had been formed on six continents, and the organization adopted the name Rotary International a year later.

As Rotary grew, its mission expanded beyond serving the professional and social interests of club members. Rotarians began pooling their resources and contributing their talents to help serve communities in need. The organization's dedication to this ideal is best expressed in its principal motto: Service Above Self. Rotary also later embraced a code of ethics, called The 4-Way Test, that has been translated into hundreds of languages.

During and after World War II, Rotarians became increasingly involved in promoting international understanding. A Rotary conference held in London in 1942 planted the seeds for the development of the United Nations Educational, Scientific, and Cultural Organization (UNESCO), and numerous Rotarians have served as consultants to the United Nations.

An endowment fund, set up by Rotarians in 1917 "for doing good in the world," became a not-for-profit corporation known as The Rotary Foundation in 1928. Upon the death of Paul Harris in 1947, an outpouring of Rotarian donations made in his honor, totaling US\$2 million, launched the Foundation's first program — graduate fellowships, now called Ambassadorial Scholarships. Today, contributions to The Rotary Foundation total more than US\$80 million annually and support a wide range of humanitarian grants and educational programs that enable Rotarians to bring hope and promote international understanding throughout the world.

In 1985, Rotary made a historic commitment to immunize all of the world's children against polio. Working in partnership with nongovernmental organizations and national governments thorough its PolioPlus program, Rotary is the largest private-sector contributor to the global polio eradication campaign. Rotarians have mobilized hundreds of thousands of PolioPlus volunteers and have immunized more than one billion children worldwide. By the 2005 target date for certification of a polio-free world, Rotary will have contributed half a billion dollars to the cause.

As it approached the dawn of the 21st century, Rotary worked to meet the changing needs of society, expanding its service effort to address such pressing issues as environmental degradation, illiteracy, world hunger, and children at risk. The organization admitted women for the first time (worldwide) in 1989 and claims more than 90,000 women in its ranks today. Following the collapse of the Berlin Wall and the dissolution of the Soviet Union, Rotary clubs were formed or re-established throughout Central and Eastern Europe. Today, 1.2 million Rotarians belong to some 30,000 Rotary clubs in more than 160 countries.

"PROJECT CARE" - in Aid of the Sarawak Children's Cancer Society


In line with what was called upon by our Rotary International President Bichai Rattakul in this year theme of "SOW THE SEEDS OF LOVE" - our Club took upon a year project entitled "PROJECT CARE".

The objects of the Project Care are:-

(1) to create greater Public awareness of cancer among children

Statistics show that 60 to 70 new cases of childhood cancer are diagnosed annually in Sarawak. The most common types of childhood cancer are leukaemia, brain tumours, neuroblastoma, wilm's tumour and non-Hodgkin's lymphoma.

- (2) to help in giving financial and emotional support to the parents of such children suffering from cancer.
- (3) to help support a halfway house providing temporary accommodation for child cancer patients and their families while undergoing treatment in Kuching.
- (4) to help in raising funds in the prevention, control, diagnosis and treatment of childhood cancer.



The Project is initiated by the ROTARY CLUB OF KUCHING CENTRAL. It is to be carried out jointly with MAXIS, PROFIT SUMMARY SDN BHD (a consortium of handphone dealers) and the Sarawak Tribune.







(i) Our Club:

would officially launched the "Project Care" on the 1st July 2002 in the presence of the Sarawak Social Development and Urbanisation Minister Dato Sri Dr. James Jemut Masing at Dewan Asajaya Holiday Inn Kuching. Thereafter our club will continue to publicise the project with the assistance of the local dignitaries. Furthermore our club will help in raising public awareness of the suffering of the children with cancer and to seek for donations.

(ii) FOR MAXIS AND PROFIT SUMMARY SDN BHD:

Under the Project, Profit Summary Sdn Bhd will donate RM40.00 from every Maxis registration to Sarawak Children's Cancer Society a sum which represents all their profits. This sum will be topped up ringgit for ringgit by Maxis Mobile Sdn Bhd.

The funds raised will go toward providing drugs for cancer treatment and maintaining pin-prick blood-analysing equipments at the Sarawak General Hospital Cancer Unit.



CONSEQUENCE OF THE PROJECT

- (i) From Official report, the project has helped in enhancing the public awareness of the children cancer. Since the launch of the project on 1st July 2002 numerous donations have been pouring to the Sarawak Children's Cancer Society. This is due to the much publicity that has been made in the local media. Slightly over 3 months after the project was launched estimated funds raised through the Maxis registration was RM40,000.00 while generous public donations has totalled over RM200,000.00;
- (ii) More public donations and pledges are still coming in and;

(iii) A pin-prick blood analysing equipment worth RM35,000.00 was donated by Kim Hin Industry Bhd and the handing over of the said machine was in fact witnessed by our District Governor Mike Graham Parry (see photograph).

BARIO PROJECTS

BARIO PROJECTS:

A COMMUNITY SERVICE PROJECT THROUGH THE DONATION OF ONE COMPLETE SET OF PORTABLE DENTAL EQUIPMENT AND DENTAL CHAIR TO THE BARIO COMMUNITY

BACKGROUND:

BARIO is a village community deep in the interior highland of Sarawak. Best known for its hill paddy namely "Bario Rice" (a premium rice).

RCKC has been assisting the Bario community since 1998 by providing building materials in the construction of a suspension bridge through our community service project.

The catalyst of our present Bario Dental Equipment project dated back to Rotary year 1999/2000 with the request from the community through the principal of SMK Bario, namely Ms. Lucy Bulan. Our assistance was sought to provide a dental chair for the community as the existing dental chair was in a very poor state.

Our board of directors approved as to the project and upon our follow up and communication with Ms. Lucy Bulan and the doctors/dentists of Miri Hospital and the "flying doctor" service to Bario, it was

determined that the real need to the Bario community was in fact for a dental equipment to be permanently housed in Bario.

Prior to this the flying doctor service in Bario was only able to carry out tooth extraction as there was no dental equipment to carry out basic tooth filling and other dental procedures.

As the result of our club donation of a portable dental equipment, the Bario community will now benefit from having better dental care and health care. The procedure will still be carried out by the flying doctors/dentist service. Plan has been made for the Miri Hospital to train nurses based in Bario on basic dental procedures, so as to provide basic dental care in the absence of the "flying doctor service".

FUNDING/SPONSORS:

Once the dental equipment has been identified with recommendation from Miri Hospital the task was in the raising of RM15,000 - RM18,000 towards the costs of the equipment.

The majority of the funds was raised by way of generous direct donations by our own members and a sum of RM2000 was kindly donated by the Rotary Club of Orskog District 2280, Norway which was chartered on 13th May 1980. This was made possible through the good contact of our past member Rotarian Tor Dalen who is now a member of this club.

HANDOVER:

On 16th February 2003 at our regular club meeting, we have a handing over ceremony. Present to receive the dental equipment and dental chair were Yang Berhormat Dr. Judson Sakai Tagal, the Assistant Minister for Infrastructure Development and Communication Sarawak who is also the elected State Assembly Representative of Bario. Also present were members of the Bario Community.

The event proceeded smoothly with the commitment by Minister Dr. Judson and our club to identify future deserving community project based on the ideals of Rotary.






