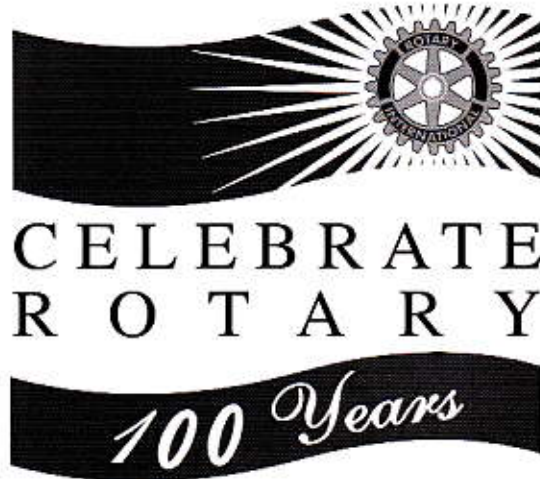

## OBJECT OF ROTARY

The object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:



***First:***

The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service.

***Second:***

High ethical standards in business and professions; the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations, and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society.

***Third:***

The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business and community life.

***Fourth:***

The advancement of international understanding, goodwill and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.





# ROTARY HISTORY

## *A Brief History*

The world's first service club, the Rotary Club of Chicago, Illinois, USA, was formed on 23 February 1905 by Paul P. Harris, an attorney who wished to recapture in a professional club the same friendly spirit he had felt in the small towns of his youth. The name "Rotary" derived from the early practice of rotating meetings among members' offices.

Rotary's popularity spread throughout the United States in the decade that followed; clubs were chartered from San Francisco to New York. By 1921, Rotary clubs had been formed on six continents, and the organization adopted the name Rotary International a year later.

As Rotary grew, its mission expanded beyond serving the professional and social interests of club members. Rotarians began pooling their resources and contributing their talents to help serve communities in need. The organization's dedication to this ideal is best expressed in its principal motto: Service Above Self. Rotary also later embraced a code of ethics, called The 4-Way Test, that has been translated into hundreds of languages.

During and after World War II, Rotarians became increasingly involved in promoting international understanding. A Rotary conference held in London in 1942 planted the seeds for the development of the United Nations Educational, Scientific, and Cultural Organization (UNESCO), and numerous Rotarians have served as consultants to the United Nations.

An endowment fund, set up by Rotarians in 1917 "for doing good in the world," became a not-for-profit corporation known as The Rotary Foundation in 1928. Upon the death of Paul Harris in 1947, an outpouring of Rotarian donations made in his honor, totaling US\$2 million, launched the Foundation's first program — graduate fellowships, now called Ambassadorial Scholarships. Today, contributions to The Rotary Foundation total more than US\$80 million annually and support a wide range of humanitarian grants and educational programs that enable Rotarians to bring hope and promote international understanding throughout the world.

In 1985, Rotary made a historic commitment to immunize all of the world's children against polio. Working in partnership with nongovernmental organizations and national governments through its PolioPlus program, Rotary is the largest private-sector contributor to the global polio eradication campaign. Rotarians have mobilized hundreds of thousands of PolioPlus volunteers and have immunized more than one billion children worldwide. By the 2005 target date for certification of a polio-free world, Rotary will have contributed half a billion dollars to the cause.

As it approached the dawn of the 21st century, Rotary worked to meet the changing needs of society, expanding its service effort to address such pressing issues as environmental degradation, illiteracy, world hunger, and children at risk. The organization admitted women for the first time (worldwide) in 1989 and claims more than 90,000 women in its ranks today. Following the collapse of the Berlin Wall and the dissolution of the Soviet Union, Rotary clubs were formed or re-established throughout Central and Eastern Europe. Today, 1.2 million Rotarians belong to some 30,000 Rotary clubs in more than 160 countries.



### 2004-05 Rotaract Presidential Citation

Rotaract Clubs may also be recognized for undertaking worthy service activities that Celebrate Rotary and Rotaract. To qualify for the citation, Rotaract clubs must complete at least four activities in any of the four Avenues of Service, one of which must fall under community service and one under international service. The sponsoring Rotary club president and the RI district governor must sign the Rotaract Presidential Citation Certification Form (900C-04EN) and submit it to RI World Headquarters by 15 April 2005.

### Recognition for Rotary Clubs

To receive the 2004-05 Presidential Citation, clubs will undertake a well-rounded program of activities within each of the four Avenues of Service. Determine the number of activities your club must undertake based on the size of your club's membership according to the chart below:

Club Size (as of 1 July 2004)	Number of accomplishments
50 or fewer members	2
51-150 members	3
151-200 members	4
201 or more members	5

Select activities under the Opportunities for Service listed in this brochure and achieve them between 1 July 2004 and 1 April 2005. Complete the Presidential Citation Certification Form (900B-04EN), and send it to your district governor to certify your club's accomplishments. Your governor must submit the certification form to RI World Headquarters by 15 April 2005.

### Recognition for District Governors

To qualify for a citation, 50 percent or more of the clubs in your district must earn a citation, and you must establish a district family of Rotary committee to assist with projects and activities in support of Rotarians and their families.

### Opportunities for Service

#### Celebrate Rotary in your club

- Create a membership recruitment plan to achieve the greater of a net increase of 2 members or 3 percent net membership growth by 1 April 2005.
- Create a membership retention plan to slow attrition to less than 3 percent annually.
- Encourage diversity of membership and promote a balanced membership. Induct new members from demographic groups not currently represented in your club.
- Sponsor a new Rotary club.
- Appoint a family of Rotary committee to assist with projects and activities in support of Rotarians and their families.
- Invite members to bring their partners and/or children to a club meeting or event on at least five occasions.
- Welcome and include non-Rotarian family members (e.g., spouses, adult children, parents, widows, or widowers) into the family of Rotary through service and fellowship activities.
- During Family Month (December), recognize the importance of Rotarians' families and their contributions to your club's success.
- Appoint a centennial committee and a club historian to coordinate and promote centennial activities and create or maintain a club history to be presented at one meeting.
- Invite at least one Rotary Foundation alumnus or alumna to join your club.
- Recognize a club member with the Four Avenues of Service Citation for Individual Rotarians.
- Develop and initiate a new project in support of club service or the family of Rotary.

#### Celebrate Rotary in your vocation

- Ask each member of your club to share information on Rotary International and the club's activities with their places of business and/or their professional associations.
- Hold one or more club meetings at the workplaces of newer members.
- Hold a forum on ethics and the application of the Four-Way Test in business and professional life or present all new club members with a copy of the *Declaration of Rotarians in Businesses and Professions* (200-EN).
- Ask each member of your club to mentor a young person.
- Sponsor a day for Rotarians to bring young people to their places of business to share career opportunities.
- Sponsor or participate in a career development project for people with disabilities.
- Sponsor or participate in a skills retraining project for those returning to the work force.
- Organize a special vocational service activity during Vocational Service Month (October) or register a club member as a Rotary Volunteer.
- Nominate a community member as a candidate for the Rotary Centennial Service Award for Professional Excellence to your governor.
- Develop a project to improve literacy and numeracy in the workplace.
- Develop a campaign to improve vocational or professional skills in the workplace.
- Develop and initiate a new project in support of vocational service.

#### Celebrate Rotary in your community

- Actively participate in Rotary's centennial celebration activities.
- Conduct a Centennial Community Project.
- Contact local media to publicize Rotary's role in the Global Polio Eradication Initiative.
- Conduct a community needs assessment and establish one new service project this year.
- Ensure that a significant number of club members and their partners participate in new service projects.
- Initiate an ongoing community water project (e.g. water resources, water conservation, safe drinking water).
- Sponsor or participate in a project designed to promote urban peace or conflict resolution.
- Sponsor or participate in a project to improve literacy and numeracy.
- Sponsor or participate in a health awareness campaign or a project that addresses health concerns.
- Sponsor or participate in a project that addresses the problems of child abuse, street children, and/or domestic violence.
- Sponsor a new Interact club, Rotaract club, or Rotary Community Corps.
- Conduct a Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) event.

#### Celebrate Rotary in our world

- Participate in at least one PolioPlus or PolioPlus Partners project.
- Achieve the Every Rotarian, Every Year goal of US\$100 or more per capita in Annual Programs Fund contributions.
- Support the Permanent Fund Initiative by securing at least two new bequest commitments.
- Participate in the Centennial Twin Club program.
- Sponsor a Centennial Group Study Exchange (GSE) team.
- Participate in The Rotary Foundation's Individual Grants program by sending a Centennial Rotary Volunteer from your club.
- Sponsor or host a Youth Exchange student or conduct a Rotary Friendship Exchange.
- Identify a qualified candidate to compete at the district level for at least one Rotary Foundation Educational Programs award (Ambassadorial Scholar, Rotary World Peace Scholar, Group Study Exchange (GSE) team member or leader, or Rotary Grants for University Teachers participant).
- Support or register a project on the World Community Service Projects Exchange.
- Seek a Foundation Matching Grant for a water resource, health, or literacy project.
- Register both the club president and incoming club president for the 2005 RI Convention in Chicago.
- Develop and initiate a new project in support of international service.

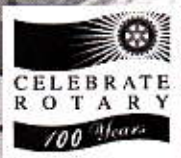

## COMMUNITY SERVICE PROJECTS AND ACTIVITIES

Rotary Community Service is to encourage and foster the application of the ideal of service to the personal, business and community life of every Rotarian. Community Service is an opportunity for every Rotarian to exemplify 'Service Above Self'. It is the commitment and social responsibility of every Rotarian and Rotary Club to improve the quality of life for those who live in the community and to serve the public interest.

Rotary International and our District 3310 have outlined a number of goals, objectives and associated activities to be carried out as opportunities for service for the current Rotary Year.

To meet the above-mentioned goals, objectives and responsibilities, the Rotary Club of Kuching Central has planned and undertaken a comprehensive program of activities for the current Rotary Year, some of which are as follows:

### 1. Rotary Flood Relief Project in Sarawak

A disastrous flood situation occurred in many parts of Sarawak which caused sufferings and difficulties to many people in the towns as well as in the rural areas in February 2004.

At the height of the flooding, more than 10 thousand people, especially those in the rural areas were evacuated to higher grounds and sheltered in relief centres. The flood situation left behind a trail of destruction across vast areas in Kuching and surrounding areas. There was widespread electricity blackout and many villages were under several meters of water, a few major roads were cut off while others were chocked with massive traffic jams, farmlands were destroyed, 121 schools were closed, many houses and bridges were damaged or destroyed due to landslides or being swept away by swift currents. A number of fatalities were reported due to landslides or drowning.

Outside of Kuching, the worse affected areas were the Samarahan Division and Bau District. In the Asajaya District in Samarahan, floodwater inundated thousands of homes with water level reaching in excess of 6 feet in certain areas. Six families lost their homes due to landslides and swift water current. In Bau District, landslides caused damages to at least 11 houses, with one fatality. More than five thousand residences were relocated to higher grounds during the flooding.

Rotary Club of Kuching Central with the support of District Governor David Tong and 5 Rotary Clubs in Johor, namely the Rotary Clubs of Johor Bahru, Puteri Lagoon, Kulai, Pontian and Skudai decided to jointly lend a hand to the flood victims in 2 rural areas outside of Kuching, Sarawak.

### 2. Lend a Hand to the Sick, Disadvantaged, Disabled and Elderly in our Community

Our Club strongly supports the efforts of other Service and Charitable organizations in their roles to help the sick, disadvantaged, disabled and elderly in our community. We help them in their fund raising projects by participating in their Annual Charity Sales, for example:

Sarawak Children's Cancer Society  
Salvation Army Children's Home  
Sarawak Society for Parents of Handicapped Children  
Sarawak Society for the Blind  
School for the Intellectually Disabled Children

### 3. Poverty Alleviation Project

In response to RI President Jonathan B Majiyagbe's call to emphasize on alleviation of poverty, our Club launched a poverty alleviation project by donating one year's supply of breakfast



cereals and biscuits to residents of the Sarawak Hun Nam Siang Tng (Home for the Aged). The project was successfully carried out on 11 October 2003 in conjunction with the visit of DG David Tong and District First Lady Irene.

#### 4. Distribution of 'Ang Pows' and Foodstuff to Residence of Home for the Elderly

As a tradition for many years, our Club members annually visit the residents of the Home for the Elderly to distribute money and foodstuff to the residents in connection with the Chinese New Year celebration. Our service is to help bring cheer and uplift the morale of these senior citizens. Many of the senior citizens are homeless and without relatives to care for them and have been long-term residents there. Some are also very sick. Providing support, comfort and showing respect to the elders or senior citizens are highly recognized virtues in our local customs and tradition. This annual project is carried out with the full participation and support of our Rotarians, their family members as well as Rotaractors and Interactors as a joint community service project.

#### 5. Promotion of Literacy and Education

Our Club has for many years participated in the GAP program by sponsoring 2 volunteers from United Kingdom to teach English at Chung Hua Middle School No. 4 in Kuching, Sarawak for the promotion of education and literacy, in particular the English language.

The program for the Chinese School started in 1999. Because of the success with the School and the students, Chung Hua Middle School No. 4 has requested that we continue the program as an ongoing project.

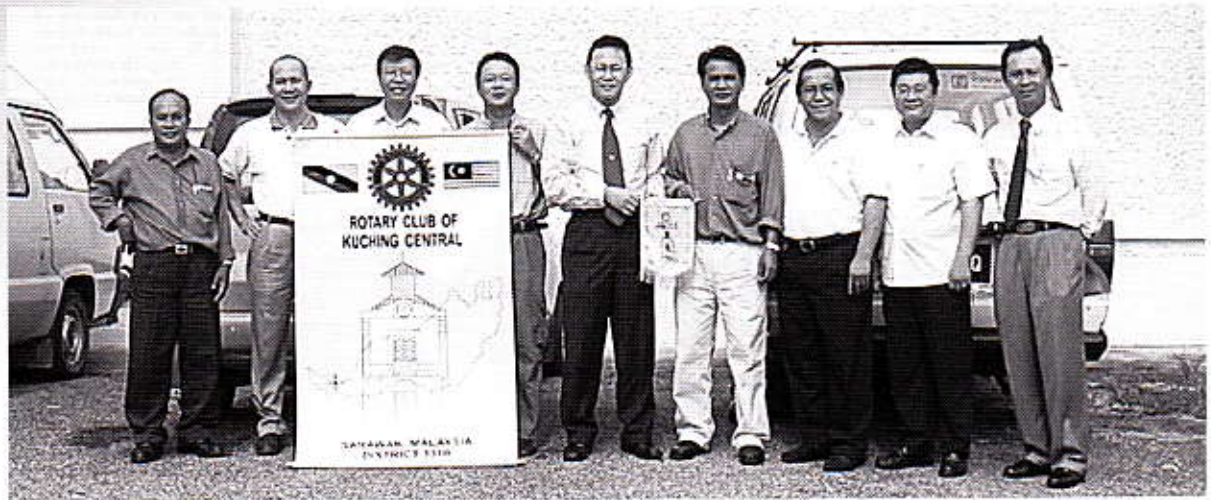

### Rotary Clubs present aid to landslide, flood victims

**KUCHING:** The Rotary Club of Kuching Central in collaboration with the Rotary Club of Johor Bahru, Puteri Lagoon, Pontian, Kobi and Domes 3310 provided financial aid and food supplies to landslide and flood victims whose houses were damaged recently.

Nine members of the club, led by President Sylvester Fong, visited Kampung Podam yesterday with the help of Senior Administrative Officer, Abdul Rahman Barahim.

594 Bidayuh, whose main religion is Christianity, live in the village.

Three families whose houses

were damaged by a landslide received RM500 each and food supplies. The families were headed by Abu anak Gasir, Makil anak Gilit and Edmund Moring anak Tikus.

The club also donated food supplies to 138 families at Kampung Podam with the help of Ketua Kampung, John Jimbek.

In Bau District, seven villages were affected by the recent floods. 5,394 people from the villages were also relocated to relief centres because of the floods.

"We hope our action will inspire more members of the public to help

the landslide and flood victims. We received some cash donations and used clothes from members of the public. They asked us to help them distribute the goods to the needy after they heard what we did for the flood victims in Asajaya last week," said Fong.

The Rotary Club of Kuching Central was established in December 1986.

For the past 10 consecutive years, the club had bagged the Rotary International Presidential Citation awards for its fine achievements and performances. It had also received several awards from Rotary International District 3310.

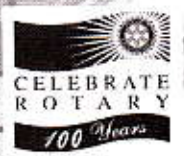

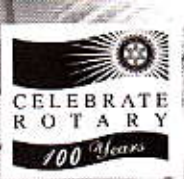

### 1. Promotion of and Provide Support to The Rotary Foundation

Our Club was given the opportunity to host and organize The Rotary Foundation (TRF) seminar in Kuching. The seminar was organized to educate Rotarians, especially the new Rotarians, on the goals and programs of TRF.

### 3. Promotion of International Goodwill and Friendship Between Rotarians Worldwide

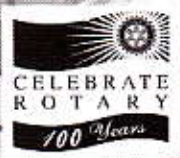

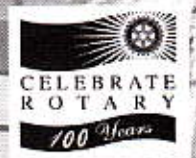

## SERVICE TO NEW GENERATIONS PROJECTS AND ACTIVITIES

It is the responsibility of each Rotarian to prepare the New Generations – all young people up to the age of 30 – by improving their life skills to ensure a better future, while recognising the diversity of their needs. All Rotary Clubs are encouraged to undertake projects that support the fundamental needs of the New Generations: health, human values, education and self-development.

The Rotary International Structured Programs for New Generations are: Interact, Rotaract, Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA), and Youth Exchange.

Interact Clubs are organised for the purpose of providing an opportunity for young people to work together in world fellowship dedicated to service and international understanding. Students at the secondary or pre-university level or young people aged 14 to 18 are eligible for Interact Club membership.

The purpose of Rotaract is to provide an opportunity for young men and women to enhance the knowledge and skills that will assist them in personal development, to address the physical and social needs of their communities, and to promote better relationships between all people worldwide through a framework of friendship and service.

Some of our Club's projects and activities focussed on supporting the development of young people are as follows:

### 1. Support of Rotary Youth Leadership Awards Event

Our Club encouraged and sponsored Rotaractors and Interactors to attend RYLA held in Kuching, Sarawak from 12 to 15 December 2003 at the Sarawak Cultural Village.
