


With the continuous rapid development of Sarawak, it is important for us to have the existence of service organisations like Rotary so that we do not lose the values of caring and 'Service Above Self'.



First:

High ethical standards in business and professions; the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations, and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society.

Third:

The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business and community life.

Fourth:

The advancement of international understanding, goodwill and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

ROTARY HISTORY

A Brief History

he world's first service club, the Rotary Club of Chicago, Illinois, USA, was formed on 23 February 1905 by Paul P. Harris, an attorney who wished to recapture in a professional club the same friendly spirit he had felt in the small towns of his youth. The name "Rotary" derived from the early practice of rotating meetings among members' offices.

Rotary's popularity spread throughout the United States in the decade that followed; clubs were chartered from San Francisco to New York. By 1921, Rotary clubs had been formed on six continents, and the organization adopted the name Rotary International a year later.

As Rotary grew, its mission expanded beyond serving the professional and social interests of club members. Rotarians began pooling their resources and contributing their talents to help serve communities in need. The organization's dedication to this ideal is best expressed in its principal motto: Service Above Self. Rotary also later embraced a code of ethics, called The 4-Way Test, that has been translated into hundreds of languages.

During and after World War II, Rotarians became increasingly involved in promoting international understanding. A Rotary conference held in London in 1942 planted the seeds for the development of the United Nations Educational, Scientific, and Cultural Organization (UNESCO), and numerous Rotarians have served as consultants to the United Nations.

An endowment fund, set up by Rotarians in 1917 "for doing good in the world," became a not-for-profit corporation known as The Rotary Foundation in 1928. Upon the death of Paul Harris in 1947, an outpouring of Rotarian donations made in his honor, totaling US\$2 million, launched the Foundation's first program graduate fellowships, now called Ambassadorial Scholarships. Today, contributions to The Rotary Foundation total more than US\$80 million annually and support a wide range of humanitarian grants and educational programs that enable Rotarians to bring hope and promote international understanding throughout the world.

In 1985, Rotary made a historic commitment to immunize all of the world's children against polio. Working in partnership with nongovernmental organizations and national governments thorough its PolioPlus program, Rotary is the largest private-sector contributor to the global polio eradication campaign. Rotarians have mobilized hundreds of thousands of PolioPlus volunteers and have immunized more than one billion children worldwide. By the 2005 target date for certification of a polio-free world, Rotary will have contributed half a billion dollars to the cause.

As it approached the dawn of the 21st century, Rotary worked to meet the changing needs of society, expanding its service effort to address such pressing issues as environmental degradation, illiteracy, world hunger, and children at risk. The organization admitted women for the first time (worldwide) in 1989 and claims more than 90,000 women in its ranks today. Following the collapse of the Berlin Wall and the dissolution of the Soviet Union, Rotary clubs were formed or re-established throughout Central and Eastern Europe. Today, 1.2 million Rotarians belong to some 31,000 Rotary clubs in more than 166 countries.




- on 2nd May, 2005, a ceremony was held to recognize corporation and individuals who has contributed towards Rotary Clubs in Kuching in our service to our community.

SERVICE TO NEW GENERATIONS PROJECTS AND ACTIVITIES

The objectives of Rotary Service to New Generation are to undertake projects and activities that support the development of leadership qualities, communication skills, elements of community and global citizenship.



Aceh Tsunami Disaster Relief Efforts Committee of the Rotary Club of Kuching Central

On 26 December 2004, a major earthquake occurred near the Northern part of Sumatera which caused heavy damages to buildings. It also created the occurrence of Tsunami immediately after. Phuket, Sri Lanka, Andaman Islands, Maldives and the western coasts of Northern Sumatera including the town of Banda Aceh, were badly damaged.

The death toll in Northern Sumatera represented the highest casualties of all the places that were affected by this catastrophe.





The Rotary Club of Kuching Central immediately responded and set up a 15-member Tsunami Disaster Relief Efforts committee chaired by PP Andre Suharto with President Aw Tai Hui as the advisor.

Immediate contacts were made with two Rotary clubs in Medan namely the Rotary Clubs of Langkat and Deli Medan after consulting Rotary District 3400

The Rotary Club of Langkat, through PP Ibrahim Champion, was quick to reply and after several exchanges of emails, both parties identified and agreed that the need for medical items was the top priority. Meanwhile, the committee anticipated that the issue on logistics had to be addressed. With the help of Rotarian Steve Ng, the committee was given support by Malaysian Airlines Systems (MAS) for free air cargo to airfreights donated medical items from Kuching to Medan, North Sumatera.



On 3rd & 5th January 2005, a total of 2,782 KGs of medical aids were acquired by the committee with the help of Normah Medical Specialist Center and Timberland who helped to supply us with some of the item. They also put us in touched with suppliers of various medical items who sold these items to us at prices lower than what

3 tons of Urgent Medical Supplies on the way to Aceh.

they sell to the hospitals. When they heard of the efforts put up by the Rotary Club of Kuching Central, some of the pharmacies and suppliers of medical drugs, decided to come forward to donate some medical items.

All ground handling of logistics in Kuching was provided by Sinar Mekar Sdn Bhd, a global logistic provider, whose CEO is our Incoming President Augustine Wong.

The medical aids were airflown to Medan for distributions by Rotary Club of Langkat (jointly with Aceh Sepakat NGO) to the affected areas in Northern Sumatera.

At the same time, fund raising exercise was also initiated. With the help of the local media and much publicity, many individuals and corporate bodies came forward to donate money and medical items. Within 14 days, the committee raised nearly RM170,000.00.

It was slightly after 100 days since the incident happened when the committee is of the opinion that a timely visit to the Aceh province was appropriate. PP Andre Suharto and Rtn. Ng Yaw Hua left Kuching for Banda Aceh via an overnight stay in Medan from 13 to 15 April 2005. PP Andre Suharto is also a member of the Rotary District 3310 Tsunami Disaster Relief Committee whose chairman is PDG Gerald Minjoot.

How the medical aids were distributed:

- Consignments of medical aids were sent by air, compliments of MAS (Malaysian Airlines Systems) from Kuching to Medan on 3rd and 7th January 2005 at 1,640Kg and 1,142 Kg respectively.
- > They were received on 4 & 8 Jan. 2005 by Rotary Club of Langkat.
- Rotary Club Langkat joined forces with another NGO, Aceh Sepakat, to help distribute the medical aids from 4th to 19th January 2005.
- In view of Zainul Ariffin General Hospital in Banda Aceh being damaged by the Tsunami, many of the victims were transferred out of the affected areas to the District hospitals located between Banda Aceh, Medan and in smaller towns like Sigli, Lhokseumawe, Bireun.
- The medical aids were distributed to the following villages as indicated in the map below under the supervision of Dr. Hasdiana Hasan, chairman, distribution & logistics from Aceh Sepakat.





Areas that were visited by PP Andre Suharto & Rtn. Ng Yaw Hua in the Aceh Province as indicated in the map below:





Observations & findings:

- Half of Banda Aceh town and as well as its coastal suburbs are still in ruined with practically no development at all taking place apart from several long houses that have been built by the central government.
- ii. Many are still living in make-shift tents that are provided by the NGOs, UNHCR, Red Cross, MERCY Msia
- iii. Clean drinking water supply is still problematic. Most rely on well water for drinking and this water may not even been tested to gauge the quality level for drinking.
- iv. Sanitation is also lacking in view of the fact that many houses were demolished and damaged by earthquake and the Tsunami.
- The Acehnese is trying to find ways to help them be able to earn their living again. For the fishermen, they hope to be able to get a fishing boat because many of the boats were either damaged beyond repair or banished during the catastrophe.
- vi. The Banda Aceh Water Board authority used to have 25,000 consumers and now only have around 8,000. This is an indication on how many houses have been destroyed by the Tsunami and earthquake.

- 3 units of fogging equipment & chemicals for Zainul Ariffin General Hospital in Banda Aceh (for prevention of Aides mosquitoes breeding).
- ii. Castor wheels (for fitting on hospital beds).
- iii. Dump trucks for clearing of household wastes.
- iv. Ambulance.
- v. Forklift.
- vi. Excavator.
- vii. Lockable wooden boxes to keep merchandise items (for small traders to keep their goods for sale).
- viii. Vacancies for household maids in Malaysia.
- Scholarships for university students (requires Rp20million (about RM8,000) to complete their studies.
- x. Computers, scanners, copier, modems, printers.
- xi. Makeshift tents at Singkil.
- xii. Prosthetic limbs.
- xiii. Purchase of boats for fisherman (perhaps through the use of microcredit scheme)

In the course of the strong water current resulting from the Tsunami, many people who survived, swallowed mud and contaminated water. Because of lack of 'suction' equipment, doctors were not able to 'suck' these materials from the body resulting in infections. After prolonged condition, many died. Hence the following equipment are needed:

- xiv. Bronchoscopy (suction equipment).
- xv. Laparoscopy (suction equipment).


2. Other known activities by Rotary clubs:

- D3300 visited Medan during Aidil Adha to contribute 10 cows for slaughtering to donate to the Muslims community at the refugee center in Medan.
- Received 30 units of water treatment equipment from District 3300.
- R.C. of Taipei with a club in D3300 donated an ambulance.

The District is also considering to build an orphanage at Siborongborong (located around 1 hour by road from Sibolga, the ferry point to Nias island) together with Rotary Club of Queenstown.



You would have read from the email that was sent out by PP Dr. Ho Loon Shin yesterday concerning this matter (Thanks, PP Dr. Ho for relaying the message).

I would now like to take this opportunity to provide more details:

Assistant Governor (AG) Hj Odita Ibrahim passed away in Phnom Penh on 2 Jan 2005.

I was told that he was sent to Cal Mette Hospital in Phnom Penh and passed away not long after being admitted to the hospital. The doctors and nurses tried to revive him but to no avail. His younger brother, Wasli Ibrahim, has reached Phnom Pehn last evening and is making preparation works to bring back the body with the help of the Malaysian Embassy as well as some friends that we know who are attached to Petronas in Phnom

Penh. My wife and I as well as PP Chieng Lee Ching & Pauline together with Rtn Wilford Teo had the task of having to

deliver the tragic news to Norlida (AG Odita's wife) yesterday morning at 8.45am. It was the most difficult tasks to do in our entire life.

It is anticipated that the body will be flown back either today (very slim chance) or the latest by Wednesday. It is a public holiday today in Phnom Penh and therefore it is a challenge to get customs clearance and complete all documentation works. However, all religious obligations have been performed such as cleansing the body and wrapping it in white loin cloth. The body was brought to the mosque for prayers where around 100 local Moslems participated to offer prayer. After which, the body was sent back to the hospital.

He may have suffered heart attack.

AG Odita Ibrahim is one of the chartered members of the Rotary Club of Kuching Central when the club was incorporated in December 1986. He was our first Youth Service Director. He was a president of our club in 1991-1992 and subsequently held a number of appointments at Rotary International District 3310. In this Rotary year (2005-2006), he is the Assistant Governor for all the four Rotary Clubs in Kuching (Group 10).
