





## ROTARY HISTORY

## A Brief History

he world's first service club, the Rotary Club of Chicago, Illinois, USA, was formed on 23 February 1905 by Paul P. Harris, an attorney who wished to recapture in a professional club the same friendly spirit he had felt in the small towns of his youth. The name "Rotary" derived from the early practice of rotating meetings among members' offices.

Rotary's popularity spread throughout the United States in the decade that followed; clubs were chartered from San Francisco to New York. By 1921, Rotary clubs had been formed on six continents, and the organization adopted the name Rotary International a year later.

As Rotary grew, its mission expanded beyond serving the professional and social interests of club members. Rotarians began pooling their resources and contributing their talents to help serve communities in need. The organization's dedication to this ideal is best expressed in its principal motto: Service Above Self. Rotary also later embraced a code of ethics, called The 4-Way Test, that has been translated into hundreds of languages.

During and after World War II, Rotarians became increasingly involved in promoting international understanding. A Rotary conference held in London in 1942 planted the seeds for the development of the United Nations Educational, Scientific, and Cultural Organization (UNESCO), and numerous Rotarians have served as consultants to the United Nations.

An endowment fund, set up by Rotarians in 1917 "for doing good in the world," became a not-for-profit corporation known as The Rotary Foundation in 1928. Upon the death of Paul Harris in 1947, an outpouring of Rotarian donations made in his honor, totaling US\$2 million, launched the Foundation's first program — graduate fellowships, now called Ambassadorial Scholarships. Today, contributions to The Rotary Foundation total more than US\$80 million annually and support a wide range of humanitarian grants and educational programs that enable Rotarians to bring hope and promote international understanding throughout the world.

In 1985, Rotary made a historic commitment to immunize all of the world's children against polio. Working in partnership with nongovernmental organizations and national governments through its PolioPlus program, Rotary is the largest private-sector contributor to the global polio eradication campaign. Rotarians have mobilized hundreds of thousands of PolioPlus volunteers and have immunized more than one billion children worldwide. By the 2005 target date for certification of a polio-free world, Rotary will have contributed half a billion dollars to the cause.

As it approached the dawn of the 21st century, Rotary worked to meet the changing needs of society, expanding its service effort to address such pressing issues as environmental degradation, illiteracy, world hunger, and children at risk. The organization admitted women for the first time (worldwide) in 1989 and claims more than 90,000 women in its ranks today. Following the collapse of the Berlin Wall and the dissolution of the Soviet Union, Rotary clubs were formed or reestablished throughout Central and Eastern Europe. Today, 1.2 million Rotarians belong to some 31,000 Rotary clubs in more than 166 countries.

## LITERACY PROJECT FOR RESETTLEMENT COMMUNITY

The reasons why these areas have been included in this project is because a preliminary study by SAWF found that there is still a high incidence of illiteracy in these 4 communities. An estimated population of 1,500 people and of these 40% are illiterate and semi-literate.

### **Project Implementation**

There will be 1 co-ordinator and 4 volunteers who will be invloved in this project. The co-ordinator will work with the communities to organize the trainings. There will be a taskforce who oversees the progress of the project.

Four vision meetings will be held in the 4 communities whose purpose is to introduce the project and as well as to identify 20 volunteers to act as facilitators. The facilitators will be given a 5-day training. The total project is estimated to last 6 months over 3 phases.

The Rotary Club of Kuching Central is undertaking a literacy project for several resettlement communities in Kuching. The project is jointly undertaken with Society for the Advancement of Women and the Family, Sarawak (SAWF). The project will be launched today by Rotary International District 3310 Governor Tay Kim Ann during his official visit to Rotary Clubs in Kuching and to be witnessed by President Augustine Wong of the Rotary Club of Kuching Central, Mrs. Maria Peter (Trainer & Co-ordinator from SAWF) and Mrs. Grete Fozdar (co-ordinator from SAWF).

### Background of the Project

Literacy goes beyond the mechanics of reading and writing and should endow the participants with a desire to draw upon the power of expression for inner personal transformation. Mothers are often the first educators of the next generation. However, often girls are given a few years of education and then taken out of school if they are needed at home to look after the younger siblings or to work on the farm.

It is regrettable that youth, especially girls aged 10-16 are among those taken from school to help at home and thus are allowed to lapse into illiteracy.



## LITERACY PROJECT IN NORTHERN THAILAND

Location:

Huay Chompoo Village, Muang District, Chiang Rai, Thailand The Village is situated on top of Maesuay Mountain, 33km west of Chiang Rai, 785km northof Bangkok and 180km north-east if Chiang Mai.



Purpose:

The purpose of this project is to purchase commodities to repair and equip Huas Champoo (HC) Village library, train HC Village teachers to teach students and villagers to use the library resources and provide two 5-day residential "Active English Camps" for 60 underprivileged school children from Rotary District 3360.

Details:

Purchase repair materials and equip the library with a variety of books, magazines, and audio visual and computer materials current and appropriate for the educational and reading levels of students and villagers. These resources need to be supported with library furniture.

Train HC teachers to promote lifelong learning among students and villagers by designing activities which encourages reading, using the library materials and creating a library search tool facilitating students and villagers using the book collection.

Provide two consecutive, 5-days residential "Active English Camps" for underprivileged children and 4 observation teachers in Rotary District 3360. The Camp's curriculum is designed by a specialized TEFL (Teaching English as a Foreign Language) training organization using "active learning" methods to deliver an integrated skills approach to English for communication. The Camp will be conducted by qualified TEFL instructors supported by experienced camp counsellors.

Benefits:

i) Basic Literacy – Due to Huay Chompoo Village's isolated location on a remote mountain in northern Thailand; the community has suffered neglect from the state-run education system. Through initial efforts within the scope of our Rotary Centennial Community project, villagers have received assistance to build a library (Among other buildings and services). The Huay Champoo Village library will service 345 local students and 4 other schools in the area will approximately the same number of students. The library will be also used by public health personal and 23,456 villagers. This project will follow-up and broaden

Rotary's commitment to this village by specifically aiming to raise basic literacy rates and attitudes through the establishment of a fully-functional library staffed by trained teaching personnel. Rotarian Kornkamon Ramabutra of Rotary Club - Chiang Mai Thin Thai Ngam (Deputy Director of Chiang Mai University Library) and Rotary Volunteer Arunrat Wongchaya (Librarian of the Chiang Mai University Demonstration School) will set up a training program for teachers who will take charge of the library and its activities. The teachers will come to Chiang Mai University and other school libraries for training and familiarization in librarian skills. Once trained, the teachers will return to "Huay Chompoo Village" school to manage the library functions, and will be assisted to acquire recommended books, magazines, newspapers and all related necessities.

ii) English Literacy - Recognizing English as an essential tool for development of human resources, there is an intense and urgent need within communities in Rotary District 3360 to promote children's long-term interest in, and practical usage of, the language. Although English is taught in Thailand's schools, those efforts suffer from outdated techniques, illtrained instructors, and inadequate contact hours. A series of two consecutive, 5-day "Active English Camps" would bring together groups of up to 60 children and 4 observation teachers from Rotary District 3360 for intensive coaching in English for communication. The Camp will show children how to use English in real-life situations through a combination of modern teaching techniques delivered by native-speaking instructors as well as field-trips for observation and practice. All campers will have extended opportunities for fellowship and language practice since board and lodging would be provided for the duration. The learning experience will be supplemented by extra materials, fieldtrips/excursions, and E (Emotional) and Q (Intelligence)-development exercises: Experienced Camp counsellors will take care of the children throughout the Camp.


# SERVICE TO NEW GENERATIONS PROJECTS AND ACTIVITIES "NO APOLOGIES WORKSHOP"
