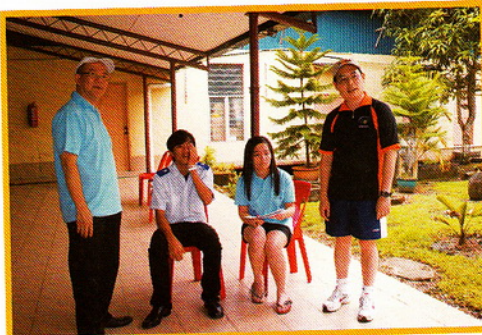

Health Screening Project at The Salvation Army

On 20 February 2011, the Rotary Club of Kuching Central, the Salvation Army Boys and Children's Home carried out a health screening project to provide medical screening services to the children hosted by the Salvation Army Homes.

The screening and vaccination of 82 children were carried out at the Salvation Army Boy's Home at Jalan Ban Hock. The purpose of the screening was to provide basic health checks, gross physical assessment, vaccinations for Hepatitis B and Tetanus, de-worming and eye checks to these children.

Three medical doctors and a total of 28 Rotarians, Rotary spouses & family members assisted in the health screening process of 82 children.

Rotary Brings Vision To Sarawak (1)

In a concerted collaboration between CIMB Foundation, Department of Health Sarawak, the Ophthalmology Department of Sarawak General Hospital & the Rotary Club of Kuching Central, 29 cataract patients from the low income group who live in Serian, Sri Aman, Betong & Lundu were transported to the Eye Clinic at Sarawak General Hospital, Kuching where they underwent cataract operations with great success.

A total of 40 medical staff which included 6 eyes specialists participated in the project which began with a simple launching ceremony at 3pm on 10th December 2010. The launching was officiated by Dr. Zulkifli Jantan, Director of the State Health Department Sarawak.

The eyes specialists were led by Dr. Intan Gudom, Head of the Ophthalmology Department at the Sarawak General Hospital.

All the 29 cataract operations were carried out smoothly on 10th & 11th December 2010. All patients were discharged on 12th December after post – surgical examinations.

This Eye Project was fully sponsored by CIMB Foundation.

Rotary Brings Vision to Sarawak (2)

From 9-12 June 2011, the 2nd Eyes Project under "Rotary Brings Vision to Sarawak", free cataract & pterygium operations for 43 low income individuals who live in Pulau Beruit were held at Daro Hospital.

These patients, each was accompanied by their next-of-kin were transported by chartered express boat from Pulau Beruit to be admitted into Daro Hospital on 9th Jun. PP Sylvester Fong & Rtn Louis drove from Kuching with medical equipments on 8th June. Other Rotary members with the medical team from Kuching departed for Sibul on Friday, 9th June. From Sibul, they took 2 hours express boat ride to Daro.

Upon arrival at Daro Hospital, the eyes specialists led by Dr. Mohamad Aziz Salowi immediately got down to work. The 1st cataract operation began at 1pm & the eye specialists worked all the way through until 10pm.

Post operations review was carried out the following day. Twenty four patients were discharged on Saturday. The remaining patients were operated on Saturday 11th June and subsequently discharged on Sunday 12th June.

The project was financed by CIMB Foundation and other sponsors such as Harwood Timber Sdn. Bhd. and Normah Medical Foundation & Charitable Trust Board as well as The Crocodile Foundation in Singapore.

LIVING WATERS VILLAGE HEALTH PROJECTS

Ronny Heyboer, his wife Kay and their 3 children moved to Kalimantan, Borneo Island in 2002. In 2003 they acquired 270 hectares land in the heart of Borneo far away from any village or town and started the Living Waters Village Children Home. The villagers in the surrounding have almost no income and suffer from malnutrition, malaria and other health problems. In many cases they cannot take care of their children. Health care is none existent for children's and adults. The next bigger town is 12 hours drive away.

Within the last 7 years Ronny Heyboer has built a village for 500 children and provides for them home, food and education. However he has only very limited facilities for health care and quality nutrition. Clean water is still a major problem during dry season from May to September every year.

With the support of IPP Thomas Ngu we have installed a shredder machine for compost production. The compost is used to grow vegetables.

Through the effort of PE Juergen Ertl & our sister Club, The Rotary Club of Taipei Golden Eagle in a joint International Community Service Project we donated an Ultrasound Scanner. The scanner is currently being used by doctors for medical treatment, both at the Living Waters as well as surrounding villages.

Rotary brings vision to people of Pulau Beruit

A concerted collaboration between CMH Bank Sarawak Branch, Sarawak Health Department, and the Ophthalmology Department of Sarawak General Hospital, the Rotary Club of Kuching Central provided free contact lens prescriptions operative to 43 low income individuals who live on Pulau Beruit from June 9 to 12.

The operation was held at the Duro District Hospital because there is no operating theater on Pulau Beruit. Most of the patients are from Kampong Beruit, Kampong Telokong and some patients from Kampong Piniabah.

There was much planning and logistic being put into logistics management in getting patients who live from outside of Kampong Telokong and Pandang to come and assemble at Kampong Beruit on a Friday at 7am. They had to be transported in longboats. Many thanks to the assistance provided by staff of Duro, Nurah Faus Abdul Rahman (Yaku), who made logistic arrangements for the longboat.

The presence of the Medical Assistant, Edward Al Allan at Kampong Beruit was also valuable because he was the only person able to convey the news of the operations to the patients and he always manage to get them to assemble on time at Kampong Beruit.

A bus on Friday, June 11, Edward assisted and accompanied the patients to board the charter boat across exposed boat with which the patients departed from Kampong Beruit to Duro. The boat had to make two stops because there were altogether 60 people. This was because each patient was being accompanied by one assistant to take care of them during the journey and while they stay at Duro for three nights. For some, this was the first time for them being so far away from home and for so many days.

Some of the patients were so excited and looking forward to the whole exercise that they could

from the Rotary Club of Kuching Central. They were transported by rented van from Duro jetty to Duro Hospital in six vans. The two Rotary members left Kuching for Duro by car two days ahead. They arrived in Duro ahead of the rest of the project team to ensure that all arrangements were done according to schedule.

All Duro hospital, the patients had to register for admission and undergo screenings for blood pressure etc. The friendly staff at the Duro District Hospital was so efficient that the whole process of admission only took 30 minutes to complete. The rest of the time spent in the hospital for the duration of the project.

Meanwhile, the remaining Rotary members, eye specialists and ophthalmologists departed Kuching for Sibul by air on Friday evening from Sibul, they took the express boat to Duro and arrived on location at 11.30am.

Upon checking in at the hotel, the eye specialists immediately get down to work and the first contact operation began at 1pm on the same day. The eye specialists worked all the way through until 10pm.

The eye specialists, led by Dr Mohammed Aziz Sabawi, are indeed a group of very dedicated people who are so passionate with their professions that they did not realise they worked for so many hours to help the less fortunate,

said Frankie Ong, President of the Rotary Club of Kuching Central. Post-operation review was carried out on the following day, resulting in 24 patients being discharged on Sunday. The characterised express boat brought them back to Kampong Beruit. The remaining patients were operated on Saturday and subsequently discharged on Sunday morning.

The project was mostly financed by CMH Foundation through CMH Bank Sarawak Branch with other sponsors such as Harwood Thibodeau Side and Norman Medical Foundation & Charitable Trust Board as well as The Coccolite Foundation (in Singapore)," said Haji Ali Saibani, the project advisor and past president of the Rotary Club of Kuching Central.

This is the third contact operation project undertaken by the club that is financed by CMH Bank and CMH Foundation. The first project was carried out in Kapit town in 2008 while the second contact project was for the people of Berang, Serian, Selatam and Lunan," said the project organising chairman Pua President Chai Ko Joo of the Rotary Club of Kuching Central who is also a qualified optometrist.

The club plans to undertake another major contact operation in the remote areas of Sarawak this year should the club find raising activities are successful.

The project was officially closed with an appreciation dinner held in Duro in the presence of Abdullah Saidu (ADN) for Pulau Beruit) where certificates of appreciation were presented by Frankie to each of the medical team members and those who contributed to the project. Prior to the dinner, Abdullah took the opportunity to meet and talk with the patients (who are seen in his constituency) in the hospital ward.
