*Rotary International* formed in 1905 is an organization of service clubs known as Rotary Clubs located all over the world. It is a secular organization open to all persons regardless of race, religion, color, creed, gender or political preference. There are more than 33,000 clubs and over 1.2 Million members worldwide. The purpose of the organization is to bring together business and professional leaders to provide humanitarian service, encourage high ethical standards in all vocations, and help build goodwill and peace in the world. Members usually meet weekly, which is a social event as well as an opportunity to organize work on their service goals.

Rotary best-known motto is : **SERVICE ABOVE SELF**

## OBJECT

The object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:

## FIRST

The development and acquaintance as an opportunity for service.

## SECOND

High ethical standards in business and profession, the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations, and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society.

### FOURTH

The advancement of international understanding, goodwill and peace through a world of fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

## AVENUE OF SERVICE

Based on the Object of Rotary, the avenue of service are Rotary's philosophical cornerstone and the foundation on which club activity is based:

### CLUB SERVICE

Focuses on strengthening fellowship and ensuring the effective functioning in the club.

### VOCATIONAL SERVICE

Encourages Rotarians to serve others through their vocations and to practice high ethical standards.

### COMMUNITY SERVICE

Covers the projects and activities the club undertakes to improve life in its community.

### INTERNATIONAL SERVICE

Encompasses actions taken to expand Rotary's humanitarian reach around the globe to promote world understanding and peace.

## THE FOUR WAY TEST

The test, which has been translated in more than 100 languages, ask the following questions of all the things we think, say or do:

1. Is it the **TRUTH** ?
2. Is it **FAIR** to all concerned ?
3. Will it build **GOODWILL** and **BETTER FRIENDSHIPS** ?
4. Will it be **BENEFICIAL** to all concerned ?

## ROTARY AND UNICEF

The greatest example of Rotary's effective collaborations is its flagship program, Polio Plus, which aims to eradicate polio worldwide. Working with spearheading partners UNICEF, the U.S. Centers of Disease Control and Prevention, and the World Health Organization, Rotary has contributed over US\$600 million and countless volunteer hours to help immunize more than two billion children against the crippling and often fatal disease.

Bills and Melinda Gates Foundation has awarded Rotary USD355 million to support its effort to eradicate polio. In respond, Rotary has committed to raise USD200 million by 30th June 2012. As of this month, Rotary has raised about USD130 million.

## ROTARY AND UNITED NATIONS

Rotary and United nations have a long history of working together and sharing similar visions for a more peaceful world.

In 1942, clubs from 21 nations organized a conference in London to develop a vision for advancing education, science, and culture after World War II. That event was a precursor to UNESCO. In 1945, 49 Rotarians went to San Francisco to help draft the UN Charter. Rotary and UN have been close partners ever since, a relationship that's apparent through Polio Plus and work with UN agencies.
